The Almont DDA has been busy and we would like to share with you what has been accomplished over the last 12 months:

- ✓ The DDA welcomed 2 news business with Ribbon Cuttings (Doctors of Physical Therapy and Century 21 AAA North)
- ✓ Contracted out all snow plowing of the 6 parking lots in the CBD
- ✓ Contracted out all snow & ice removal for sidewalks in front of businesses
- ✓ Awarded a Façade Grant to Sherri's Barber Shop
- ✓ Contracted out to have the Downtown clock restored to current technology
- ✓ Contracted out grass cutting in the Industrial Park
- ✓ Continue to maintain the Pocket Park as well as the fountain
- ✓ Planned, organized and ran the very successful Heritage Festival and Classic Car Show with the help of many valuable volunteers
- Planned, organized and ran, with the help of many volunteers, the annual Holly Day Light Parade with 21 parade participants for the community to enjoy
- ✓ New banners were ordered and installed along M53
- ✓ Worked with First Congregational Church to mutually agree on a Parking Lot Agreement to be able to use the lot for municipal parking
- ✓ Completed another Streetscape project the Elevated Sidewalk on the North West Side of M53, which included a new wall, new railings, removal of steps and new flower baskets
- ✓ Organized and worked with Ultimate Asphalt for seal coating and stripping of two parking lots

The Almont DDA is in the process of coordinating their projects for 2022-2023 but here is a look at what we have planned thus far:

- CBD Streetscape in which the DDA will be replacing 45 Streetlights with new ones. These are needed after 24+ years
- Plan, organize and work with the volunteers to make this year's Heritage Festival and Classic Car Show a success
- ✓ Continue to work with the Lions Club on community activities
- ✓ Continue to support our local businesses
- ✓ Continue to look for new businesses for the CBD
- ✓ Plan, organize and run the Annual Holly Day Light Parade which will be on December 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2022
- ✓ Will explore the possibility of purchasing new garbage cans and a bike rack for the CBD
- ✓ Will continue to review and maintain all contracts within the CBD
